 - > Reopened 14 June 2021, staffed by Volunteers
 - Operated by the MWC Committee of our Auxiliary

- Maintain membership in southwest Oklahoma veteran's organizations (e.g., Comanche County Veterans Council).











- Award five \$1,000 scholarships to area high school seniors through the SW OK Chapter of MOAA Scholarship Fund.
- Award a \$1000 scholarship to a qualified ROTC cadet from Cameron University through the SW OK Chapter of MOAA Scholarship Fund.


