### **National Efforts**

- MOAA is a tremendous Lobby Arm
- > 400,000+ communications to Congress
- > Represents all ranks and services
- > Major Achievements over last 10 years:
  - Major Pay Raises for those Currently Serving
  - End Strength Increases
  - Survivor Benefit Upgrades
  - > Defeated Major TRICARE Fee Hikes
  - > TRICARE For Life/TRICARE Senior Pharmacy
  - Major GI Bill Upgrades (Transferability)
  - Wounded Warrior Protections
  - Elimination of the SBC/DIC Offset, "Widows Tax"



### **MOAA'S Legislative Mission for 2020**

- > Ensure any changes to the Military Health System sustain military readiness and beneficiary access to top quality care.
- Sustain military pay comparability with the private sector and block erosion of non-pay quality of life benefits.
- Protect family support programs.
- End financial penalties for military survivors.
- End concurrent receipt penalties for military retirees.
- > Achieve equity of benefits for Guard/Reserve members consistent with their active duty counterparts.
- Ensure timely access to service-earned benefits and resist proposals to erode VA and DoD delivered services.
- Support legislation, policies and programs to enable the services to recruit, retain and manage personnel.



### **State Efforts**

#### **Oklahoma State MOAA Council Priorities:**

- Home Assessed Value Reductions
  - > 20 90 % VA disability and Surviving Spouses
- > Oklahoma Military Retirement Exempt from State Tax
  - Increase deduction from 75% to 100%
- In State Tuition
  - > Veterans
  - > Dependents of Veterans
  - Members of the Uniformed Services of the US
  - > Spouses

# **National MOAA Scholarships**

- MOAA Scholarship Fund was established in 1948 to provide benefits to children of military families.
- Through 2017, the Fund has provided over \$140 million in educational assistance to over 14,000 students.
- The majority of support is provided through interest free loans.
- > SW OK Chapter contributed over \$100,000 since 2008.
  - Four \$25K nationally endowed scholarships.
  - Priority for scholarships to be used by SWOK/OK/USA



### **Area Scholarships**

- > \$1000 Area scholarships
  - > 4-5 Scholarships
  - Scholarships awarded in the Spring
- > Eligibility
  - > Service Member Sponsor
  - > JROTC/SROTC
- Committee selects the most qualified
  - > Academic Achievements (ACT and GPA)
  - > Student Resume (Work, volunteer activities, sports)
  - Character Evaluations and student essay

- > History and Location
  - > MOAA Auxiliary saw a need, teamed with ASYMCA
  - Dedicated 23 APR 2012
  - > Lounge and Kiosk located at Lawton Airport
  - MWC was expanded/renovated in late 2013.
  - > MOAA Grant provided new lounge chairs in 2019
- Volunteers
  - > 56 Active Volunteers (Have Trained over 200)
  - > Three Shifts per Day
  - > Several Recognition Dinners each year
